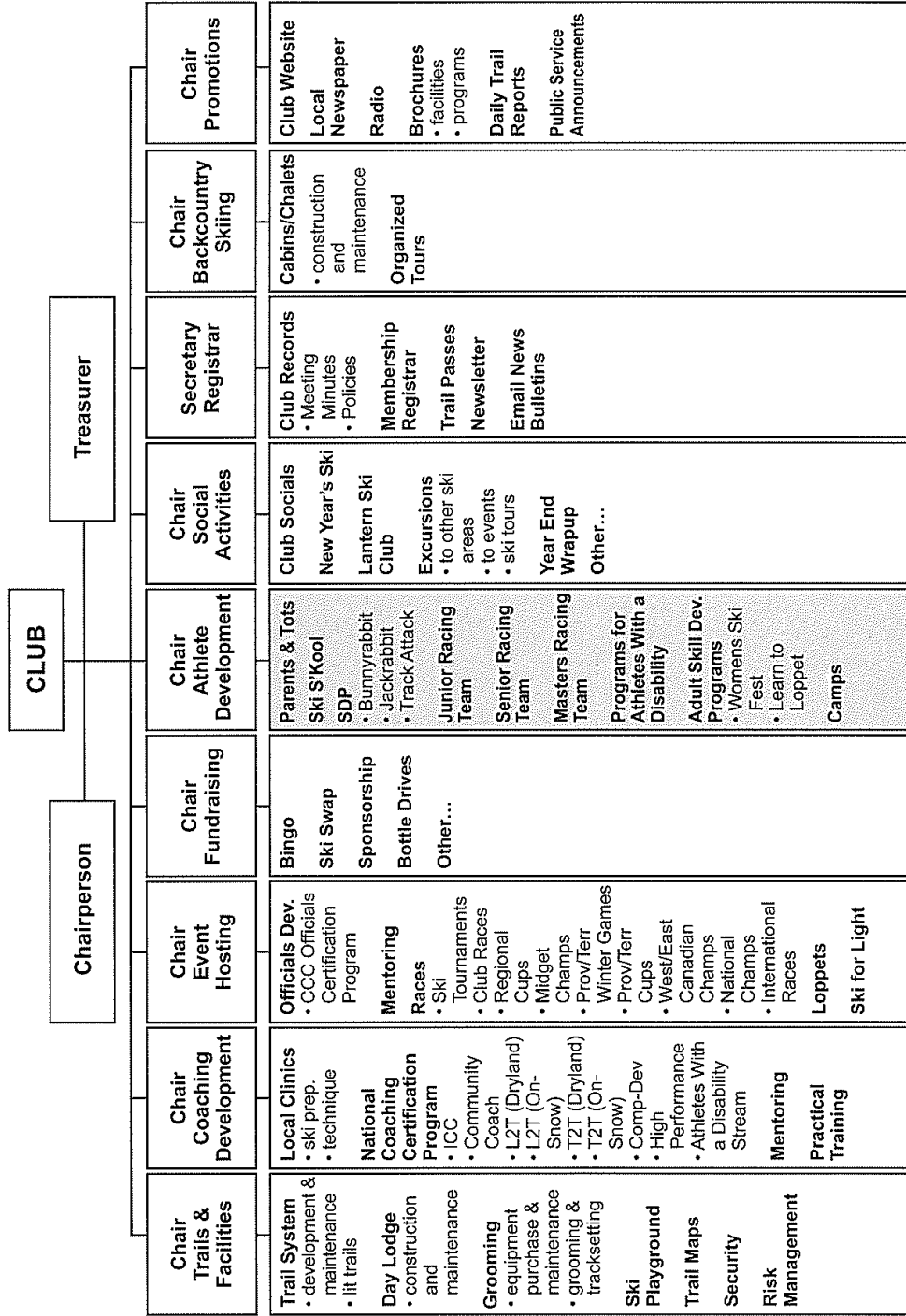

Dirk has been a leader in the development of cross country skiing in the Vancouver to Whistler region for the past two decades.

- ✓ He has been a key volunteer in the Hollyburn Cross Country Ski Club (formerly the Hollyburn Jackrabbits Ski Club) since 1980.
- ✓ He was a Jackrabbit coach for several years and he is the longest standing member of the board.

- ✓ He has been the vice president for several years and the president since 2009.
- ✓ Under Dirk's thoughtful guidance, the club has progressed from a Jackrabbit program only to a full service club. It now offers a wide range of programs to all ages and interests, including one of the strongest racing programs in the province.
- ✓ Several years ago, Dirk's main interest shifted from coaching to race officiating. He has been instrumental in developing the region from one that seldom hosted races to hosting races at the highest level. Dirk has been the driving force and the lead official in this development.

- ✓ Dirk has been involved as a volunteer and coach with the club since the 1980s.
- ✓ He has been a tireless supporter of the Skill Development Program and Officials Program and has been club president since 2009.
- ✓ He has guided the High Performance Program as well (the Club having graduated 2 athletes to the CVTC – Kajsa Heyes and Fred Weaver).
- ✓ The P'ayakentsut loppet is the 2010 Olympic legacy event at WOP and Dirk was and is instrumental in making this happen and growing it year over year.
- ✓ Dirk is a great candidate - one of the stalwart volunteers throughout the lead up to the Olympic Winter Games, both as a race official and a club leader.
- ✓ Prior to that he was one of the volunteers who took the time to travel from Vancouver to help with the Vernon World Cup in 2005, assisting in the effort to bring world cup racing back to Canada.
- ✓ He was the chief of competition for Coast Cup #1 on December 15, 2007 – the first competition at the Olympic/Paralympic venue. As venue construction was far from complete and the snow overabundant, it was a challenge. Event equipment had not arrived at the venue and it was not clear we would have venue access due to ongoing construction. The event equipment arrived the day before the event and restricted venue access was granted. Dirk pulled it off, smiling, in a snow storm.
- ✓ His roles in larger competitions leading up to and during the Games focussed on different aspects of timing and results, working in the timing room with the technical equipment he is so adept with.
- ✓ Dirk is also an effective recruiter of volunteers, taking the time to search for and recruit the skill sets required.

- ✓ Dirk keeps an open mind to new ideas and feedback, his sense of humour pops up when the stress levels are high and he stays unflappable in the storm. I don't think he is human, because he seems to function on 4 hours of sleep.

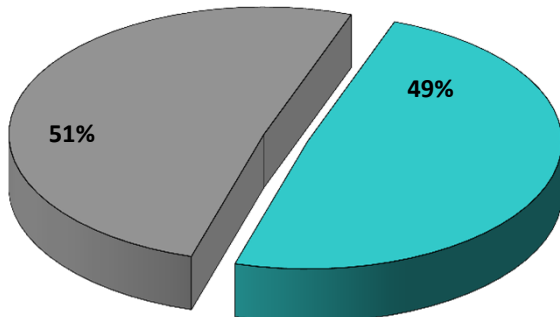

■ Male Coaches 49%

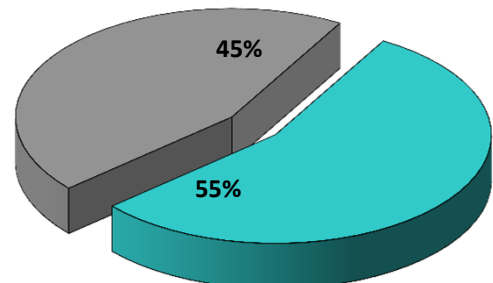
■ Female Coaches 51%

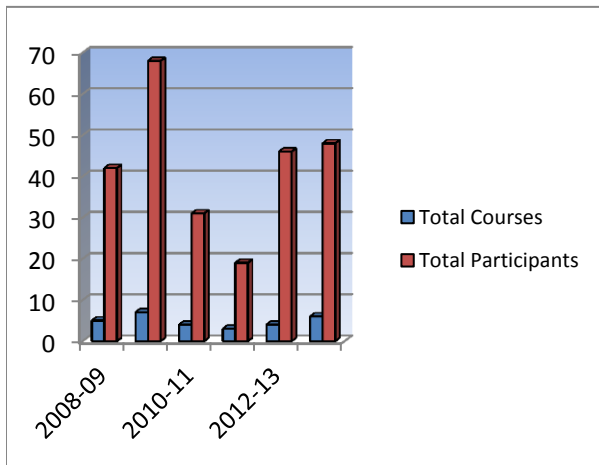

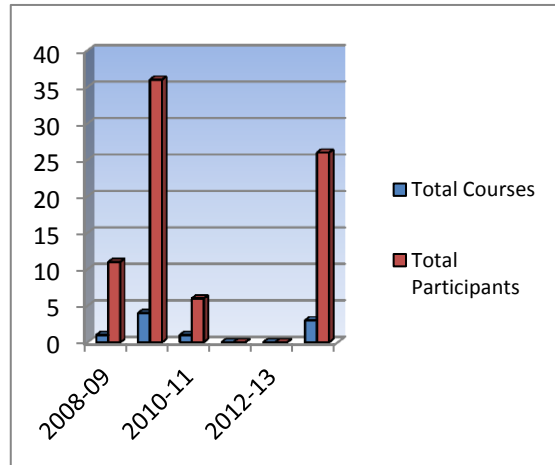

# **CCC OFFICIALS CERTIFICATION**

This program consists of five steps from entry level to international level. It includes course conductor training, technical delegate training and event management as well as technical training.

## **Level 1**

This is a 10 hour course that provides an overview of what a cross country ski competition is all about. The focus is on the duties of minor officials for both Olympic Style (individual start, mass start, pursuit start, relay start and sprints) and Loppet Style (mass participation) competitions.

**Course fee for CCBC members: \$60.00**

**Course fee for non-members: \$75.00**

## **Level 2**

This is a 16 hour course that prepares officials for a leadership role on a competition committee for club, provincial and national competitions including the BC Cup Series, BC Winter Games and loppets. The course covers all official race formats, rules and regulations, rule interpretation, electronic timing, all aspects of the results system, and volunteer management.

**Course fee for CCBC members: \$75.00**

**Course fee for non-members: \$90.00**

## **Level 3**

This is a 3.5 day course. It is designed to prepare an official to: (1) effectively structure, staff and manage a Competition Committee at Provincial through National level competitions, (2) perform any 'major official role at the National Championship level, (3) perform the role of a provincial Technical Delegate, and (4) have a good understanding of CCC/FIS rules.

Notes to Financial Statements

## **Nature of operations:**

Cross Country BC (the "Association") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of British Columbia and accordingly is exempt from income tax under provisions of the Income Tax Act provided certain requirements of the Income Tax Act are met. It is not a registered charity that can issue tax receipts. Its purpose is to provide provincial programming for the continuous development of cross-country skiing programs, recreational through to competitive, to a broad cross section of the community.

## **1. Significant accounting policies:**

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-For-Profit Organizations in Part III of the CPA Canada Handbook. The Association's significant accounting policies are as follows:

### **(a) Fund accounting:**

The Association reports its activities on a fund accounting basis. A fund is determined for the purpose of carrying on specific activities or attaining certain objectives in accordance with special regulations, restrictions or limitations. Each fund has its own statement of net assets which presents the results of operations for the fund. The statement of financial position of the Association includes the assets, liabilities and net assets of all funds presented in the financial statements.

### **(b) Revenue recognition:**

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions which include donations and government grants.

Contributions that are unrestricted are recorded as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Government grants approved but not received at the end of an accounting period are accrued. Restricted contributions are recognized in revenue in the period in which the expenses relating to the project are incurred.

Revenue from memberships and events are recognized when the services are provided or the goods are sold.

## 1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

### (c) Capital assets:

Purchased capital assets are recorded at cost. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution. Repairs and maintenance costs are charged to expense. Betterments which extend the estimated life of an asset are capitalized. When a capital asset no longer contributes to the Association's ability to provide services, its carrying amount is written down to its residual value.

Capital assets are amortized using the following methods and annual rates:

---

### (d) Inventory:

Inventory of supplies is measured at the lower of cost and replacement cost. The Association uses the average cost formula for all inventories of the Association. Inventories are written down to their net realizable values when the cost of the inventories is not estimated to be recoverable. When circumstances which previously caused inventories to be written-down no longer exist the previous impairment is reversed.

### (e) Use of estimates:

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with Not-for-Profit Standards requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in the statement of operations in the year in which they become known.

## 1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

### (f) Financial instruments:

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value on initial recognition. Freestanding derivative instruments that are not in a qualifying hedging relationship and equity instruments that are quoted in an active market are subsequently measured at fair value. All other financial instruments are subsequently recorded at cost or amortized cost, unless management has elected to carry the instruments at fair value. The Association has not elected to carry any such financial instruments at fair value.

Transaction costs incurred on the acquisition of financial instruments measured subsequently at fair value are expensed as incurred. All other financial instruments are adjusted by transaction costs incurred on acquisition and financing costs, which are amortized using the straight-line method.

Financial assets are assessed for impairment on an annual basis at the end of the fiscal year if there are indicators of impairment. If there is an indicator of impairment, the Association determines if there is a significant adverse change in the expected amount or timing of future cash flows from the financial asset. If there is a significant adverse change in the expected cash flows, the carrying value of the financial asset is reduced to the highest of the present value of the expected cash flows, the amount that could be realized from selling the financial asset or the amount the Association expects to realize by exercising its right to any collateral. If events and circumstances reverse in a future year, an impairment loss will be reversed to the extent of the improvement, not exceeding the initial carrying value.

### (g) Contributed services:

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year to the Association. Due to the difficult nature in determining a fair value for these services, they are not recognized in the financial statements.

## 2. Gaming activities:

Revenue earned from the Community Gaming grant is used to purchase goods and services required to provide the various programs offered by the Association during the year. As of March 31, 2014, the gaming funds that have yet to be expended are \$18,810 (2013 - \$nil).

Funds held in the Association's gaming account are restricted for these future programs, and have therefore been classified as restricted cash. The balance in this account at March 31, 2014 is \$19,399 (2013 - \$196).

The Association is not aware of any claims brought against it that if not defended successfully would result in a material change to these financial statements.

## 7. Financial risks and concentration of risk:

### (a) Credit risk:

The maximum credit risk exposure for all of the Association's current financial assets is the carrying value of those assets.

### (b) Liquidity risk:

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Association will be unable to fulfil its obligations on a timely basis or at a reasonable cost. The Association manages its liquidity risk by monitoring its operating requirements. The Company prepares budget and cash forecasts to ensure it has sufficient funds to fulfill its obligations. There has been no change to the risk exposures from 2013.

## 8. Economic dependence:

A significant portion of the Association's revenue is derived from direct and indirect funding from the Province of British Columbia and the Federal Government. In 2014, these revenues represented 25% (2013 - 35%) of total revenue.
