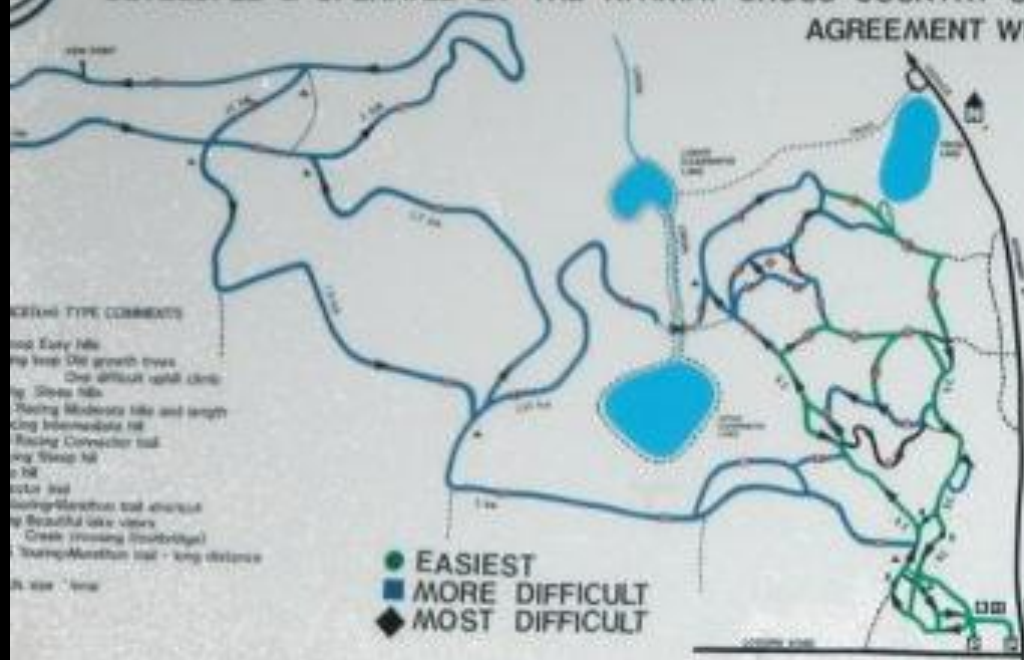

TRAIL ETIQUETTE

- Do not walk in the track
- Ski in the right track
- Give way to descending skiers
- Move out of the way when stopping
- When wishing to pass a slow skier, call "TRACK"
- Pack out all garbage
- Respect and care for the environment

SKI AREA RULES

- Ski Season - First
- No Recreational Snow
- No Vehicles or Snow
- Free to be if only
- Respect any trail
- No Dogs Allowed
- No Tree Cutting

SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS

- Ski trails are NOT MAINTAINED - take responsibility for your own safety
- Register your trip with a friend
- Never ski alone
- Ski in the direction indicated on the signs
- Ensure that you are properly clothed and equipped - rent changes in weather conditions can cause hazards on the trail
- Exercise caution when crossing creeks
- Do not ski on the lakes - ice conditions may be hazardous
- Watch for trail grooming equipment

LIABILITY

- Exclusion of liability - Assumption of risk
- As a condition of use of these facilities, the user assumes all risk of personal injury, death or property loss resulting from any cause whatsoever including but not limited to the inherent risks of skiing, collision with natural or manmade objects or other skiers, travel within or beyond the ski area boundary, or negligence (except the part of the Kitimat Cross Country Ski Club, its members, officers, sponsors, representatives, or employees, hereafter referred to as KCCSC) or the British Columbia Forest Service (BCFS). CLUB PROFILE

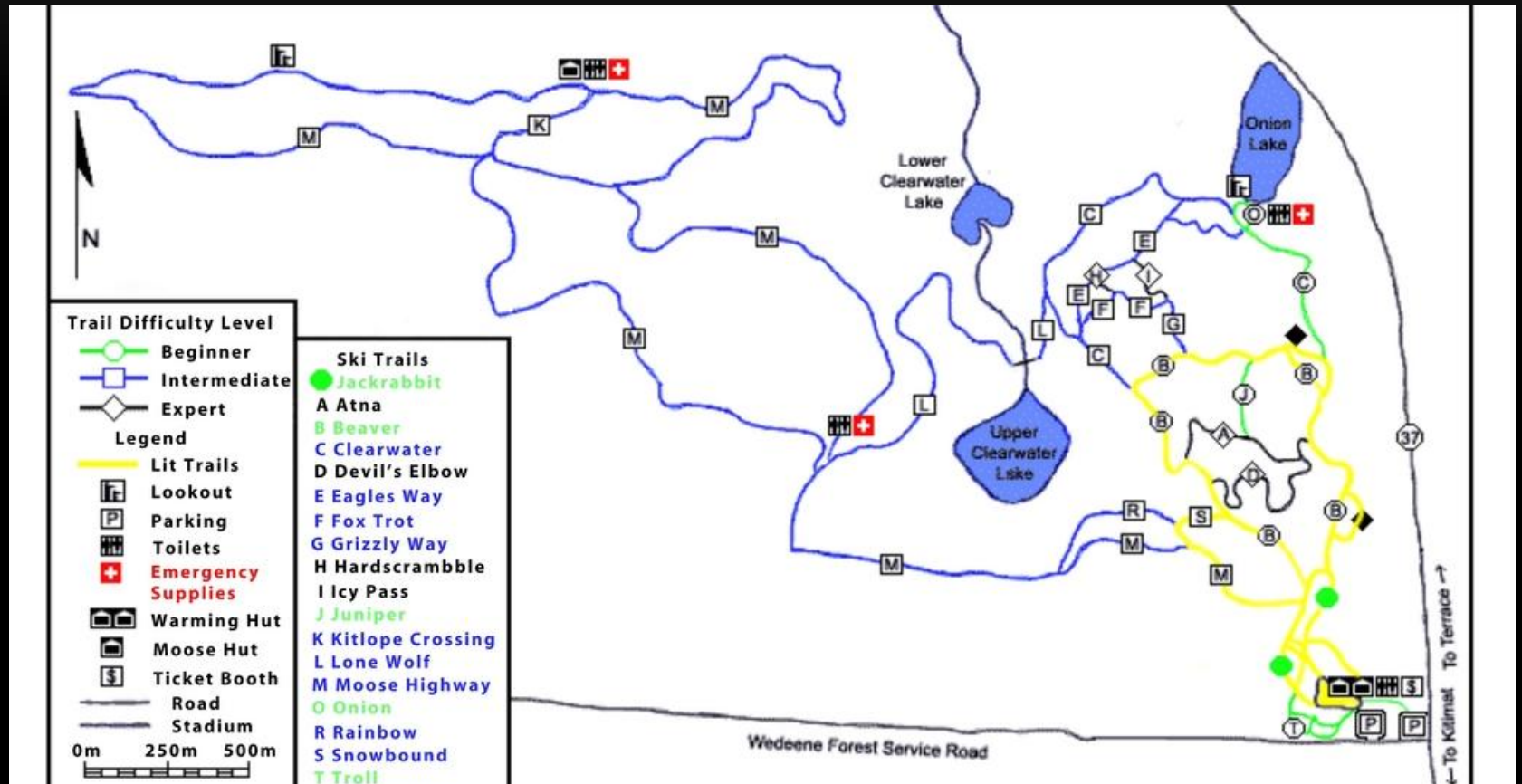
- SVNSC is nestled on a plateau halfway between Kitimat and Terrace on the south end of highway 37. About 150 km's east from Prince Rupert and 200 km's west of Smithers. We are also 560 km's west of PG. It's a long drive to Vancouver, about 1500 km's!! 15 hours.
- Elevation is approx. 600 ' (200 M's) above sea level.
- We have about 35 km's of groomed trails with 5 km's of lighted trails, available for skiing from approx. mid to early Dec. to late April depending on the snow fall amount for the season.
- Our snow base can vary from as little as 30 cm's to well over 1.5 m's of solid base.
- We have a wood stove heated lodge, running cold water and electricity. Our houses are the only waste disposal system that we currently have at present.
- For grooming we own one well used PB 200 and 2 snow machines capable of pulling a ginzu grooming unit.
- We cater to over 300 members from both the Terrace and Kitimat townships.

TRAIL SYSTEM





- - We have a small rental fleet of skis that we provide for seasonal rentals for our rabbits program kids and daily for adults
- -Provide a Bunnies through to Track Attack program that runs from Jan. through till march (approx. 10 weeks in total.) Lately the program has involved about 45-55 kids age 4 to 13.
- The opportunity for kids to be involved in a race team to re-develop has resurfaced over the last several years .
